

REGISTRATION OPENS FOR “FAIRY TALE COURTROOM” AT PRISCILLA BEACH THEATRE

-- Summer Workshop #2 Begins July 1-11 --

June 21, 2013, Plymouth, MA – Priscilla Beach Theatre (PBT) will present “Fairy Tale Courtroom”, by Dana Proulx, as the second workshop of the summer season beginning on July 1. “Fairy Tale Courtroom” is a lively comedy telling the other side of familiar fairy tales as villains, the Big Bad Wolf and the Wicked Witch, are brought to trial. Co-directed by PBT Artistic Director Marnie Almirall, and Geronimo Sands, Artistic Director Emeritus, the two-week workshop meets July 1, 2 & 3 from 9 a.m.- 2 p.m., July 5 from 1-5 p.m. and July 8, 9, 10 & 11 from 9 a.m.- 1 p.m. Performances are at 10:30 a.m. on July 12, 13, 19 & 20 at PBT’s new outdoor theatre at 800 Rocky Hill Road, Plymouth, Ma.

“This is a high energy show with a lot of fun parts for actors,” say Almirall. “From putting Snow White, the Three Little Pigs, the Big Bad Wolf and others on the stand, to actual flashbacks of the crimes in action, our actors get the opportunity to display their acting talent as well as their ability to work with an audience. Plus, the ending of each show will be a surprise. It can go either way and we will be prepared for whatever comes.”

A PBT returning alumnus, Almirall is an experienced actor who studied at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York City, and holds a BA in Spanish and an MA in Education. She also brings years of experience in directing children’s productions at PBT and other local stages. Almirall will work with students daily on new techniques and approaches in dramatic training to develop performance skills.

Priscilla Beach Theatre, located near Plymouth’s White Horse Beach, is recognized as one of the oldest and most respected summer theatrical training programs of its type in America. Each two-week workshop is \$300 per student and directed by highly qualified
